# **WCCL Constitution and Bylaws**

Women's Canadian Club London - Constitution and Bylaws The Ontario Not-for-Profit Corporation Act (2010) ONCA came into force in October 2021. Not-for-Profit Corporations in Ontario were granted a transition period of three years to update their Constitution and Bylaws in compliance with the legislation. Women's Canadian Club London, which is a Not-for-Profit Corporation had until this coming October (2024) to update our Constitution and Bylaws. A small group of Directors and Officers from our Board of Directors worked on this review earlier this spring and the new Constitution and Bylaws were approved at the Board Meeting on June 24th, 2024. The revisions to our previous Constitution include:

- terminology changes consistent with the current legislation,
- a list of definitions (Article 1 Definitions)
- · a few new Articles now required under ONCA, including
  - Article II Section 2.02. (new) Disciplinary Action or Termination for Cause
  - o Article IV Section 4.01 (new) Conflict of Interest
  - Article V Section 5.07 (new) recognizing that meetings called and attended via telephonic or electronic means are equivalent to meetings held in person
  - Article VIII Section 8.05 ... approving Silent Auction being added as a Standing Committee
  - o Article IX ... revised qualifications for Officers of the Board
  - o Article XII (new) Dissolution
  - Article XIII (new) Indemnities to Directors and Officers
  - o Article XIV (new) Protection of Directors and Officers

# Josh Morgan - Mayor of the City of London



Our 2024-2025 Speaker Series will begin on September 12<sup>th</sup>, 2024 with a full line up of exciting speakers. Meetings are held the 2nd Thursday of each month (November and February will be the 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday) from September through March at the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel (300 King St, London ON) on the 2nd Floor, Ballroom. In April, we hold a Spring Luncheon.

We will be welcoming MAYOR JOSH MORGAN, of London Ontario as our first speaker on Thursday September 12, 2024, from 2pm to 3pm.

Mayor Morgan will speak on "Addressing Homelessness and Affordable Housing." A reception will follow the meeting.

Josh Morgan was elected as London's 65th Mayor on October 24th, 2022. Prior to that, he had served two terms as the City Councillor for Ward 7 being elected in 2014 and again in 2018 with support from 75% of voters.

Mayor Morgan was the first in his family to attend University after moving to London in 1998 to study at Western. During his time there, Morgan completed undergraduate degrees in Economics & Political Science, as well as an MA in Political Science.

Mayor Morgan is an active member of the London community serving in leadership positions on multiple boards and organizations. He has previously served as the City of London Budget Chair for both the 2016-2019 and 2020-2023 multi-year budgets. He stepped down from that role when he was appointed Deputy Mayor in December 2020, a position he occupied until he was elected Mayor in 2022.

He is a current member of the London Police Services Board, Western University Board of Governors, as well as boards for London Economic Development Corporation, RBC Place, and Tourism London.

Most importantly, Josh is a proud father of four children.
